**Immigrant Worker Protection Act:

Effective January 1, 2018, California's AB 450, the Immigrant Worker Protection Act imposed various restrictions on employers with regard to ICE worksite inspections, including prohibiting employers from voluntarily consenting to ICE "raids". But, on March 6, 2018, the US Department of Justice filed a lawsuit in Sacramento challenging the legality of California's sanctuary law and AB 450.
